- Aqua connectors:** Indicate OM3 or OM4 multimode fibers, optimized for VCSEL lasers and high-speed short-range data transmission, commonly used in data centers.
- Erika Violet jackets:** Sometimes used for OM4 to visually differentiate it from OM3 in high-density environments.
- Green jackets:** May represent OM5 multimode fiber, the latest standard for multimode applications.

Fiber Strand Color Coding

Inside multi-fiber cables, individual fibers follow a 12-color sequence defined by the TIA-598-C standard: Blue, Orange, Green, Brown, Slate, White, Red, Black, Yellow, Violet, Rose, Aqua. For cables with more than 12 fibers, the sequence repeats with stripes or markers to maintain unique identification. This system ensures accurate splicing, termination, and troubleshooting, especially in high-density cables.
