5. Support and Load Considerations Maintain proper support spacing, typically 1.5 to 3 meters depending on tray type and load. Center-hung supports allow easier cable installation and reduce stress on the connection. Check that the tray and connectors can handle the total cable weight to avoid sagging or mechanical failure.
