

# Cable tray wall support dimensions and specifications

- Material Thickness:** The thickness of the tray and support brackets affects load-bearing capacity. Common steel ladder trays use 16–14 gauge steel tubing for rails and stringers, which ensures adequate strength for wall-mounted spans.
- Support Spacing:** Wall supports are spaced according to the tray type, width, and load class. For ladder trays, typical wall support spacing ranges from 1.2 m to 2.4 m (4–8 feet) for medium loads, with closer spacing required for heavier cable bundles or wider trays. Perforated or solid-bottom trays may require shorter spans to prevent deflection.
- Mounting Considerations:** Wall supports should be anchored to structural elements capable of handling the combined weight of the tray and cables. Brackets are often adjustable to maintain level alignment and accommodate bends or offsets. For ladder trays, supports are usually mounted at the ends and at intermediate points to prevent sagging.
