Attach Fiber Cables: Connect the duplex fiber cable to the SFP modules. Make sure the send and receive strands are correctly crossed between switches (A to B, B to A) to maintain proper signal flow.

Optional Patch Panel: If using a patch panel, connect the fiber from the SFP module to the panel, then from the panel to the main fiber network.
