The internal diameter of the flange hub should match the pigtail pipe to ensure smooth flow and prevent turbulence or erosion. Flange standards such as ASME B16.5 define dimensions, bolt patterns, and pressure ratings to ensure compatibility and safety.

Electrical Pigtails In contrast, electrical pigtails are short wire sections used to connect multiple conductors to a single terminal or device. These do not require flanges. Instead, they rely on proper crimping, soldering, or twist-and-cap methods to maintain electrical integrity and prevent overloads or faults. Electrical pigtails are designed for safe junctions, isolation of faults, and compliance with safety codes, but mechanical flanges are unnecessary.
