

Can an FTTR splitter be connected to a network cable

How FTTR Splitters Work

Ethernet Integration: From the slave ONU, you can connect network cables (Cat5e/Cat6) to computers, switches, or other devices. This allows the optical fiber network to interface with standard Ethernet devices in each room.

Installation Considerations

Topology: A star topology is recommended, where the master ONU connects to the splitter, and each slave ONU receives a dedicated fiber line. Daisy-chaining is possible but may reduce performance.

Fiber Handling: Use SC/APC connectors or pre-terminated fibers. Ensure proper bending radius and avoid excessive tension to prevent signal loss.

Testing: After installation, verify optical power levels and Ethernet connectivity to ensure each room receives stable gigabit speeds.
