

Can cable trays be run at an angle

It is essential to verify compatibility with the manufacturer and ensure compliance with local building codes and electrical standards. Consulting a professional installer or the engineer of record is recommended before proceeding.
- Installation Complexity:** Angled installations are more complex than horizontal or vertical setups. Proper planning, specialized tools, and experienced personnel are necessary to ensure alignment, secure attachment, and long-term reliability.

Practical Tips

- Reduce support spacing in high-load areas to prevent sagging. For example, support intervals can be shortened from 3 meters to 2-2.5 meters.
- Use internal dividers or collars to add rigidity.
