- Use pigtails for distribution points:** Splicing pigtails to the main cable ensures a clean, low-loss interface for patching and device connections.
- Field termination only when necessary:** If pigtails are unavailable, use high-quality field-terminated connectors or mechanical splices, and protect the splice in a sealed enclosure.
- Label and manage fibers:** Proper organization is critical to avoid confusion and accidental damage in m...
