

Can holes be drilled under the distribution box

Drilling a hole under a distribution box is only permissible under strict conditions, primarily for drainage in surface-mounted boxes, and must follow manufacturer and safety guidelines.

General Guidelines For standard distribution boxes, drilling a hole under the box is generally allowed only for drainage purposes and only if the box is surface-mounted, pedestal-mounted, or pendant-mounted in a damp or wet location. The hole should be at the lowest point of the box to allow water to escape, and its diameter must be between 3 mm (1/8 inch) and 6 mm (1/4 inch) unless a drainage fitting is used. After drilling, the box must be inspected and tested to confirm that its safety rating is not compromised.

Underground or Pull Boxes If the distribution box is installed underground, such as a pull box or handhole, drilling under the box is generally not recommended. Instead, proper drainage is achieved by placing a layer of crushed rock or gravel at the bottom of the excavation to prevent water accumulation. Conduit entry points should be cut carefully, and the box should be leveled and backfilled to avoid deformation or water intrusion.

Key Considerations Always check the manufacturer's instructions before drilling. Ensure no live conductors are present during drilling to prevent damage or electrical hazards. Avoid compromising the IP/NEMA rating of the enclosure. For hazardous or...

314.15 Damp or Wet Locations.

There is no limit on the number of holes or location where they are drilled but the holes must be "approved". According to Article 100, "approved" means acceptable to the authority having jurisdiction.
