

Climbing poles to connect fiber optic cables

Pole Climbing and Safety Climbing poles requires proper fall protection equipment, such as a safety belt or harness. Technicians should be trained in pole climbing techniques and follow strict safety protocols to prevent accidents. Drilling into poles may be necessary to install a strand or support for the fiber cable. The strand is typically framed and secured to the pole to hold the fiber optic cable safely and maintain proper sag for thermal expansion and contraction (YouTube tutorial). Cable Installation Once the strand is in place, fiber optic cables are attached using clamps or ties, ensuring the cable is supported along the entire route. Lashed Aerial Installation of Fiber Optic Cable

Before climbing a pole, inspect it for significant deterioration and safety hazards (splintering, insect nests, sharp protrusions, etc.). Position all motorized equipment so that exhausts are directed away
