Cable Preparation Strip the outer jacket of the fiber cable carefully, exposing the inner fibers without damaging them. Protect bare fibers immediately after stripping to prevent breakage or contamination. Pierce the rubber diaphragm at the cable entry point before inserting the cable into the box.

Fiber Routing and Splicing Route fibers through plastic guide posts or trays inside the box to maintain the minimum bend radius and prevent tangling. Clamp the fiber at the splice tray entry using plastic straps to secure it. Splice the incoming fiber to the pigtail using fusion splicing or mechanical splicing, ensuring low back reflection and minimal signal loss. Store any excess fiber neatly in the splice tray or slack storage area to avoid stress on the fibers.
