

Construction site electrical distribution box numbering sequence

Power Source: If a component has multiple feeds, each feed should be labeled separately to indicate its source.

Color Coding: Emergency power equipment should have red labels with white lettering, while normal power equipment uses black labels with white lettering.

Example Labeling Format

A typical label may include: Room/Floor: H201 Power Type: N (Normal) or E (Emergency) Equipment Type: DP, MCC, or PMP Sequence Number: 1, 2, 3, etc.

Example: H201/N/DP-1 indicates a normal power distribution panel in room H-201, first in sequence.

Additional Considerations

Documentation: Maintain floor plans and riser diagrams showing panel locations, feeder routes, and interconnections. Laminated diagrams in electrical rooms help during outages or maintenance.
