Recommended Separation Guidelines General separation from power sources: Network cables should be kept at least 30 cm (1 ft) away from electrical power conduits or cables used for power distribution to minimize inductive coupling and EMI. Avoid parallel runs of power and network cables over long distances; if unavoidable, maintain maximum separation and consider using barriers or separate trays. Special considerations: Surge protectors on power circuits can limit transient disturbances affecting network cabling. Always follow local electrical codes and standards such as ANSI/TIA/EIA-569, NEC (NFPA 70), and BICSI TDM for compliance and safety. By following these separation distances and using shielding or proper conduit, you can minimize electromagnetic interference, protect signal integrity, and ensure safe installation of network cabling near distribution boxes.
