NEC requires that all receptacles must have ground connection with a minimum wire size of 14 AWG (copper) and 12 AWG (aluminum) for 15-A circuits and 12 AWG (copper) and 10 AWG (aluminum)

Each DISTRIBUTION BOX and controller must be grounded. On the US market, a 5.26 mm² (10 AWG) ground wire must be used, and in all other markets a 6 mm² must be used.
