Loose-Tube Cable Arrangement In loose-tube cables, commonly used outdoors, fibers are grouped into color-coded buffer tubes. Each tube contains up to 12 fibers, which follow the standard 12-color sequence. The tubes themselves are also color-coded using the same 12-color system. For example, in a 48-fiber cable: Divide the fiber number by 12 to determine the tube. The remainder identifies the fiber color within that tube. Example: Fiber #34 is in the Green tube (3rd tube) and is the Violet fiber inside that tube. If the fiber count exceeds 12 tubes, buffer tube stripes or binders are used to differentiate repeated sequences.

Ribbon Cable Arrangement In ribbon fiber cables, fibers are arranged side-by-side in a flat ribbon. Each fiber in the ribbon follows the same 12-color sequence. For high-count ribbons, the sequence repeats with striped or marked fibers to maintain identification.

Connector and Jacket Color Coding Connector boots indicate fiber type and polish style (UPC or APC). Matching colors ensures proper connection and prevents signal loss or damage. Outer jacket colors help identify fiber type (single-mode or multimode) and cable function. For example, indoor single-mode cables often have yellow jackets, while multimode cables may be orange or aqua.
