Advanced linings like SILICORE ULF are co-extruded permanent linings that remain unchanged for the life of the conduit, offering a coefficient of friction significantly lower than standard HDPE, which enables fiber to be installed almost five times farther in testing. These linings are typically identifiable by a contrasting color, such as white, to distinguish them from the conduit itself.

- Conduit depth:** Underground conduits are usually buried 1-1.2 meters deep to protect against accidental damage.
- Directional boring:** Liners facilitate cable installation in areas where trenching is impractical, such as under streets or sidewalks.
- Lubrication:** Ultra-low friction liners reduce or eliminate the need for messy lubricants, saving time and reducing environmental impact.
