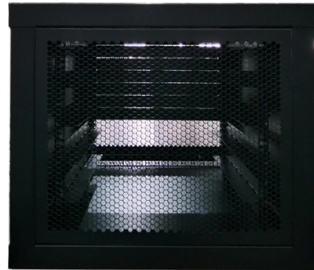

FC (Ferrule Connector): Screw-threaded 2.5 mm ferrule, secure in high-vibration environments. Common in single-mode laser systems and lab equipment. MPO/MTP (Multi-Fiber Push-On): Multi-fiber connectors for 8, 12, 24, or more fibers, used in high-speed data centers and backbone networks. MT-RJ: Duplex connector with two 1.25 mm ferrules in a single body, resembling an RJ45 plug, mainly used in multimode networks. MU: Miniature 1.25 mm ferrule connector, high-density applications, mostly in Japan. E2000: Push-...
