Alignment and Splicing: Place the fibers into a fusion splicer, which uses cameras and motors to align the fiber cores with high precision. An electric arc then melts the fiber tips, fusing them into a single continuous strand.

Protection: Cover the splice with a heat-shrink sleeve reinforced with a strength member to protect against moisture, physical stress, and environmental damage.
