Multimode (MM): Larger core ($50\text{--}62.5\mu\text{m}$) allows multiple light paths, ideal for short-distance connections within data centers or LANs, typically up to 500 meters. Connector Types Common connectors for straight-through patch cords include: LC (Lucent Connector): Small form factor, push-pull mechanism, widely used in high-density data centers. SC (Subscriber Connector): Square snap-in design, common in PON and enterprise networks. ST (Straight Tip): Bayonet mount, used in legacy networks. MPO/MTP: Multi-fiber connectors for high-density applications. Assembly Styles Simplex: Single fiber with one connector on each end. Duplex: Two fibers joined side by side, often called "zip cord," allowing simultaneous transmit and receive channels. Jacket and Protection Patch cords are typically reinforced with Kevlar yarn for strength and come in various jacket materials such as PVC, LSZH (Low Smoke Zero Halogen), or plenum-rated for fire safety. Jacket color often indicates fiber type: yellow for single-mode, orange or aqua for multimode, and lime green fo...
