Fire protection systems shall be color-coded and labeled in accordance with FC 5706.4.10.8.1 through 5706.4.10.8.2. Copies of the color code shall be posted in all central locations for fire extinguishing

29 CFR 1910.144 -

Yellow shall be the basic color for designating caution and for marking physical hazards such as: Striking against, stumbling, falling, tripping, and “caught in between.”
