Avoid tight bends, pinching, or overlapping fibers, as these can cause microbends and signal loss.

Strain Relief and Cable Entry Secure the incoming cable at the entry point using the cable gland or clamping mechanism to prevent tension on the fibers inside the box. The slack should be sufficient to allow the fiber to move slightly without stressing the splice points or connectors.

Practical Tip Always plan for future maintenance: leaving slightly more slack than the minimum requirement ensures that fibers can be re-spliced or rerouted without removing the entire cable from the box.
