Under the ECC, landowners must be notified of proposed works and are entitled to fair compensation for any impact on their property. This includes disturbance during installation and any depreciation in land value caused by the presence of the cables. If negotiations fail, disputes can be resolved through a tribunal or court.

Compensation Under the Telecommunications Act For cases involving fibre optic cables installed along high-voltage lines or leased to telecom operators, compensation is calculated based on the length of the cable on your property and its commercial use.
