

How to connect a fiber optic splice closure

- Fusion Splicing:** Align and fuse the fiber ends using a fusion splicer. This method provides low insertion loss and high tensile strength, making it ideal for long-term, high-performance connections.
- Mechanical Splicing:** Align fibers and secure them using a mechanical splice holder. This method is faster and requires less equipment but may have slightly higher insertion loss.

After splicing, place the fibers in splice trays within the closure. The trays provide mechanical support and protect the splices from environmental factors such as moisture, dust, and temperature variations.

Step 4: Organizing and Protecting Splices Arrange the spliced fibers neatly in the trays, and use heat-shrink tubing or mechanical protection to reinforce the spliced areas. Ensure that fibers are not bent beyond their minimum bend radius to...
