

How to fix vertical metal cable trays

Vertical cable trays must be securely fixed using appropriate supports, spacing, and materials to ensure structural integrity, safety, and compliance with electrical standards.

Material and Design Considerations Vertical cable trays are typically made from cold-rolled steel, galvanized steel, or aluminum alloy, with surface treatments like hot-dip galvanizing or electrostatic spraying to enhance corrosion resistance and meet anti-corrosion standards (GB/T 13912). Each tray unit includes the tray, cover, and connectors, with a load-bearing capacity of at least 200 kg/m and a fire resistance rating of GB 8624 Class B1. The tray path should avoid interference with ventilation ducts, water pipes, and other building services, maintaining a minimum clearance of 300 mm.

Support and Fixing Methods The support system is the core of vertical cable tray stability. Supports can include wall brackets, floor-to-ceiling posts, or structural frames, depending on the installation environment. Key points for vertical fixing include:

- Spacing between supports:** Determined by the tray type, material, and cable load. For example, heavier cables or larger trays require closer support intervals to prevent sagging.
- Isolation and separation:** When multiple trays are installed in layers, maintain at least 150 mm spacing between power and weak-current trays, and use isolation plates at crossings.
- Fire compartment considerations:** Reserve space for firestops and use certified firestop materials (GB 23864) when trays pass through fire-rated walls.
- Anchoring:** Use anchors or fasteners suitable for the wall or structural material, ensuring the tray is rigidly fixed and can withstand mechanical loads and environmental conditions.

Installation Best Practices

- Vertical alignment:** Ensure trays are plumb and level to prevent cable stress and maintain proper routing.
- Cable fill and routing:** Calculate maximum fill area according to NEC Table 392.22(A) to avoid overheating and maintain ampacity.
- Cable protection:** Use covers, rollers, or sheaves during cable pulling to prevent abrasion and damage.
