

How to neatly store fiber optic splice boxes

Protect Against Environmental Factors Fiber optic splice boxes should be sealed against moisture, dust, and physical stress. Use closures made from durable materials like high-density polyethylene or stainless steel, and ensure O-ring seals or armored layers are intact. Desiccants can be placed inside the closure to absorb any residual moisture, and cable entry points should have protective sleeves to prevent cuts or abrasion.

Avoid Fiber Stress and Pinching When stacking trays or closing the box, take care to avoid pinching fibers. Twisting fibers may be necessary to fit them neatly, but always follow manufacturer instructions to minimize stress. Special attention is required for ribbon fibers, which bend in only one direction, while flex ribbons allow more flexibility.
