

Installing aerial optical cables

- Choosing the Cable Type** Aerial optical cables are generally classified as:
 - Self-supporting (ADSS or figure-8):** Can span long distances without a separate messenger wire, ideal for areas without existing support lines. ADSS cables are strong, water-resistant, and UV-resistant, capable of spanning up to 1000 meters between poles.
 - Lashed to a messenger strand:** Fiber is attached to a pre-installed steel messenger, suitable for routes with existing support infrastructure.
- Installation Methods** Two primary methods are used:
 - Moving Reel Method:** A cable reel is transported along the route, and the cable is raised and lashed in a single pass. This is efficient when vehicles can access most of the route.
 - Stationary Reel Method:** Used when the route is partially inaccessible. The cable is pulled from a stationary reel and temporarily supported before being transferred to permanent hardware.
- Hardware and Tools** Essential hardware includes:
 - Cable saddles, suspension clamps, and cable rings
 - Dead-end and intermediate pole fixtures
 - Horizontal or dome fiber splice closures
 - Fusion splicers and heat shrink tubes
 - Telescoping poles and aerial storage for cable handling
- Pole and Span Considerations**
 - Dead-end poles:** Terminate and tension self-supporting cables or messenger strands.
 - Intermediate poles:** Support the cable along the route.
 - Messenger span:** Maintain proper tension a...
