

Is it possible to add fiber optic cable a switch and a monitoring system

Step 4: Configure Network Topology
Choose a topology that suits your network:
Star topology: All switches connect to a central hub or core switch, ideal for monitoring and high performance.
Daisy chain: Switches connected in series, simpler but may reduce redundancy.

Step 5: Integrate Monitoring System
To monitor the fiber network: Connect the monitoring system to a management port on the switch or use SNMP-enabled switches. Configure the monitoring software to track link status, bandwidth usage, and errors. For advanced monitoring, consider optical power meters or network analyzers to measure signal...
