

Is it safe to run cables in cable trays on floors

Running cables in cable trays on floors can be safe if proper installation, support, grounding, and cable types are used, but improper use can create serious hazards including fire, electric shock, and physical damage. Key Safety Considerations¹.

Electrical and Fire Hazards Cables in floor-mounted trays are exposed to potential physical damage, which can compromise insulation and lead to electric shock or arc-flash events. Overloading trays can trap heat, increasing insulation stress and fire risk. Proper spacing, load limits, and cable types (e.g., tray-rated or metal-armored) are essential to prevent overheating and maintain safety .

2. Physical Protection and Accessibility Floor-mounted trays are more susceptible to impact from foot traffic, equipment, or dropped tools. Using covers or protective barriers is recommended in high-traffic areas to shield cables from mechanical damage. Trays should be installed in locations that minimize exposure to hazards while remaining accessible for inspection and maintenance .

3. Compliance with Standards Cable trays must comply with NEC Article 392 and OSHA standards (1910.305(a)(3) and 1910.399). This includes proper support intervals, grounding, and use of approved cable types. Metallic trays can serve as grounding conductors if installed and maintained correctly. Fire-stops are required where trays pass through fire-rated floors to prevent fire spread .

4. Grounding and Bonding Proper grounding of floor-mounted trays is critical to prevent arcing and protect personnel. Aluminum, steel, or coated-steel trays can be used as equipment grounding conductors, but continuous maintenance and supervision are necessary to ensure safety .
