Electrical distribution boxes in factory workshops should be illuminated with at least 10 foot-candles (≈ 108 lux) of well-distributed, glare-free light, with protective covers on fixtures to ensure safety and compliance with OSHA standards.

Required Illumination Levels For areas containing electrical distribution boxes, junction boxes, or pull boxes, OSHA recommends a minimum of 10 foot-candles (fc) of illumination at the working surface to allow safe operation and inspection of electrical equipment. This ensures that workers can clearly see panel labels, switches, and wiring without straining their eyes. In general factory areas, lighting levels may range from 200–500 lux depending on task precision, but electrical panels specifically require focused, task-level lighting.

Fixture Placement and Design

- Even distribution:** Lights should be positioned to avoid shadows or dark spots around panels.
- Glare prevention:** Use diffusers or indirect lighting to minimize eye strain and prevent reflective glare on metal surfaces.
- Height and distance:** Fixtures should be installed at a height and distance that ensures uniform illumination across the panel face. Reflectors can help direct light efficiently.
- Emergency lighting:** Electrical distribution areas must have backup or emergency lighting to maintain visibility during power outages.

Safety and Compliance Considerations

- Protective covers:** All light fixtures near electrical boxes must have protective plates or guards to prevent breakage and reduce the risk of electrical hazards.
- Color rendering:** A CRI of 80+ is recommended to accurately distinguish wire colors and labels.
- Flicker-free lighting:** Avoid flickering lights, which can cause visual discomfort and reduce safety.
- Maintenance:** Ensure fixtures are accessible for maintenance without obstructing access to electrical panels.
