The solution: relocate junction boxes ABOVE insulation level, mounted on boards attached to roof webs, clearly visible and accessible from the loft hatch. Maintenance-free junction boxes for building regs compliance

Electrical switch box, also known as outlet boxes or light switch boxes, play a vital role in housing and protecting electrical connections. Building regulations require maintenance-free junction boxes when insulation will cover them. "Maintenance-free" doesn't mean they never need maintenance—it means they must be accessible without removing insulation. The panel is the central distribution point where the main electrical service enters the home and is then divided into smaller circuits.
