Step 5: Test Signal Strength If the connection remains unstable, use a fiber optic power meter or OTDR to measure signal strength and detect any breaks or attenuation points. Values outside the normal range (typically -15dBm to -30dBm) suggest a problem with the cable or connector.

Step 6: Replace if Necessary If reseating and cleaning do not resolve the issue, the cable may be damaged internally. Replace the fiber optic cable with a new one of the same type and specifications. Avoid sharp bends and maintain the minimum bend radius to prevent signal loss.
