

Mozambique is acquiring large quantities of fiber optic cables

Mozambique is significantly expanding its fiber optic infrastructure through major submarine cable projects and domestic network development to improve connectivity and digital inclusion. Submarine Cable Projects Mozambique has recently been linked to the 2Africa submarine cable, the world's largest fiber optic system, connecting the country to the United Kingdom, the Middle East, India, and other parts of Africa. The northern port of Nacala now serves as a landing point, with Vodacom responsible for bringing the cable onshore and integrating it into data centers in Maputo and Nacala. This project is expected to stimulate significant economic growth, potentially contributing \$26.2–36.9 billion to the African economy within a few years. Mozambique already has three submarine cables connecting it to the African continent, including routes through South Africa, Kenya, Cameroon, and Algeria. These cables form the backbone of the country's internet infrastructure, transmitting over 90% of international data traffic and enabling faster, more reliable digital services.
