- Multi-Duct Systems (e.g., Opti-Com®): Factory-installed inner ducts reduce twisting and friction, allow multiple cables in one outer duct, and lower installation costs by reducing manholes.

Conduit Selection Considerations

- Cable Type and Size: Ensure the conduit diameter accommodates the widest point of the cable assembly, including pulling eyes.
- Installation Environment: Outdoor, underground, aerial, or underwater installations almost always require conduit; indoor installations may be optional in controlled environments.
- Bend Radius and Pulling Tension: Maintain minimum bend radius and avoid excessive pulling tension to prevent cable damage.
- Lubrication: Pre-lubricating the conduit can reduce friction during cable installation.
- Future Expansion: Conduit simplifies adding or replacing cables without new civil work.
