Step 5: Inspect Hardware and Configuration If the cable and connectors are intact, check the transceivers, switches, or routers. Swap suspect transceivers with known-good units and ensure devices are powered on and properly configured. Look for LOS (Loss of Signal) indicators on transceivers, which signal connectivity issues. Also, verify firmware and network settings to rule out configuration errors.
