

Notes on Core Switch Adjustment and Backup



AI Overview

Effective core switch management requires proper configuration, redundancy setup, and routine backups to ensure network stability and rapid recovery.

Core Switch Configuration

A core switch operates at Layer 3 of the OSI model, handling routing and high-speed data exchange within large LANs. Key configuration considerations include:

- Slots and Modules:** The number of slots determines the number of ports and supported modules (LAN, WAN, SFP, 10Gbps, IP voice, security, monitoring) for scalability.
- Backplane Bandwidth:** Ensure sufficient backplane bandwidth to prevent bottlenecks in inter-port communication.
- Redundancy Protocols:** Use HSRP (Hot Standby Router Protocol) or VRRP (Virtual Router Redundancy Protocol) to provide automatic failover between main and backup core switches.
- Layer 2 Links for Heartbeat:** A trunk link between core switches carries VLAN traffic and serves as a heartbeat for HSRP communication.
- SVIs for HSRP:** Configure HSRP under Switch Virtual Interfaces (SVIs) for each VLAN, assigning IPs for each core switch and a virtual IP (VIP) for client access.
- Redundancy and High Availability**
- Stacking or VSS/vPC:** If supported, stack core switches or use Virtual Switching System (VSS) or vPC to make multiple switches act as a single logical unit, ensuring continuity if one switch fails.
- STP (Spanning Tree Protocol):** Prevents loops and automatically reroutes traffic in case of a core switch failure.
- Dual Uplinks:** Connect all access switches to both core switches to maintain connectivity during failover.

Configuration Backup

Regular backups are essential to minimize downtime and protect against configuration loss.

Backup Methods: Copy the running configuration to a remote server using TFTP or FTP. This ensures the current operational state is preserved.
