Fiber optic cable sizes are primarily measured in micrometers ( $\mu\text{m}$ ) for core, cladding, and buffer layers, with overall cable diameters in millimeters (mm). Core and Cladding The core is the central part of the fiber where light travels. Its size is critical for performance: single-mode fibers typically have a core diameter of 8-10  $\mu\text{m}$ , while multi-mode fibers range from 50  $\mu\text{m}$  to 100  $\mu\text{m}$  depending on the application. The cladding, which surrounds the core and ensures total internal reflection, is standardized at 125  $\mu\text{m}$  across all fiber types to maintain compatibility with connectors and splicing. Buffer and Coating Fiber cables include a buffer coating that protects the fiber from mechanical damage, moisture, and environmental stress. Buffer thickness varies: tight-buffered fibers often have a 250  $\mu\text{m}$  coating for indoor use, while loose-tube fibers for outdoor environments may have a 900  $\mu\text{m}$  coating. These layers are measured in micrometers ( $\mu\text{m}$ ). Outer Cable Diameter The overall cable diameter depends on the number of fibers, protective layers, and intended environment. Indoor cables are typically thinner and more flexible, while outdoor cables are thicker to withstand weather and physical stress. Common outer diameters are measured in millimeters (mm) and can range from a few millimeters for small drop cables to over 20 mm for high-fiber-count outdoor cables. Fiber Count and Application Fiber optic cables can contain multiple strands, with common counts including 2, 4, 6, 12, 24, 48, 96, 144, and up to 288 fibers in a single cable. The choice of core size, buffer, and overall diameter depends on the application, such as data centers, telecom backbones, FTTH (fiber-to-the-home), or industrial networks.
