For electronics, insert the male or female end of the jumper wire into the corresponding header or socket (). Splice to Main Wires Twist the bare end of the pigtail together with the main wires of the same type (e.g., all hot wires) (). Secure the splice with a wire nut or solder for electronics, ensuring no bare copper is exposed (). Check and Test Confirm all connections are tight and insulated. For electrical circuits, verify the power is off before testing and use a voltage tester to ensure safety ().
