Port aggregation can be implemented in static/manual mode or dynamic mode using LACP (Link Aggregation Control Protocol). Static mode requires manual configuration on both ends, while LACP dynamically negotiates aggregation and provides automatic failover. Types of Aggregation Switch-to-Switch Aggregation: Connects multiple switches to increase inter-switch bandwidth and ensure redundancy, ideal for backbone or aggregation layers. Switch-to-Client Aggregation: Aggregates ports to a single high-performance client, such as a server, to provide higher throughput than a single port can deliver. MC-LAG (Multi-Chassis Link Aggregation Group): Two switches operate as a single logical unit, allowing devices to connect to both switches simultaneously for load balancing and minimal downtime.
