

Safe distance between power cables and roads



Overview

Residential driveways: Driveways serving homes and commercial areas without truck traffic require a minimum of 12 feet. Electrical clearances are the minimum separation distances the National Electrical Code (NEC) requires between wiring, panels, overhead conductors, and everything around them. These rules exist to prevent electrocution, fire, and equipment damage. The NEC, published by the National Fire Protection.
