

# Should sockets be installed in a three-level distribution box



## AI Overview

Sockets should only be connected through the third-level (tertiary) distribution box, not directly to the main or secondary distribution boards.

**Hierarchical Distribution Principle** In a three-level distribution system, power flows from the main distribution board to secondary distribution boards, and then to tertiary switch boxes. Each level serves a specific purpose: the main board handles overall power distribution, secondary boards branch circuits to multiple switch boxes, and tertiary boxes control individual electrical equipment, including sockets. Directly connecting sockets to the main or secondary boards bypasses the hierarchical structure and violates safety and design principles.

**One Machine, One Switch Rule** Each tertiary switch box must follow the “one machine, one switch” principle, meaning it controls only one piece of electrical equipment, which can include a socket. This ensures proper protection, prevents overloading, and allows for the installation of leakage protection devices at the final level. Sockets should therefore be connected to the tertiary distribution box, which is the last junction before the electrical device.

**Protection and Safety** Tertiary boxes are typically equipped with leakage protection switches to safeguard connected equipment and users. The main and secondary boards may also include protective devices, but the final protection for sockets is provided at the tertiary level. This setup ensures compliance with safety standards and prevents bypassing critical protective measures.

**Practical Considerations**

- Distance:** The distance between a tertiary switch box and its connected socket should ideally not exceed 3 meters to minimize voltage drop and maintain safety.
- Separate Circuits:** Power and lighting circuits should be separated, and sockets should be on dedicated branch circuits from the tertiary box.
