Specialized underwater conduits are required for marine or submarine applications .

Conduit Material and Types Fiber optic conduits are available in rigid and flexible forms, made from materials such as PVC, HDPE, or metal, depending on environmental exposure and mechanical stress . The conduit must withstand moisture, UV exposure, temperature variations, and physical impacts to ensure long-term cable integrity . Flexible conduits are often used for indoor or short runs, while rigid conduits are preferred for long outdoor or underground installations.

Sizing Requirements Conduit size depends on the cable type, jacket rigidity, strand count, and breakout points. For example, a 6-strand indoor/outdoor cable typically requires at least a 1-inch conduit, while gel-filled OSP cables may need 1.5 to 2-inch conduits to allow smooth pulling and prevent fiber damage . Adequate sizing ensures minimal bending stress and avoids crushing or kinking during installation.

Installation Guidelines Maintain smooth curves and avoid sharp bends; follow the cable's minimum bend radius . Avoid pulling cables over edges or applying excessive mechanical pressure . Use figure-8 loops when laying cable on surfaces to prevent twisting . Protect cables from sharp rocks, uneven terrain, and environment...
