Ladder trays: Maximum support spacing is generally 3.6 meters (12 feet) for standard loads, but this should be verified against the manufacturer's load capacity chart.

Ventilated or solid-bottom trays: Spacing may be shorter due to reduced structural rigidity.
Heavy cable loads: Reduce spacing to prevent sagging or deformation.

Installation Considerations
Ensure supports are level and aligned to prevent stress on tray joints. Avoid using the tray as a walkway or lifting point; it is designed solely for cable support. Use non-metallic banding for bundled trays to prevent corrosion or staining on galvanized or stainless steel trays. Verify that all supports comply with IEC 61537 or NEC Article 392 for mechanical strength, load capacity, and grounding requirements. For long bundles during offloa...
