Check clearances from other services and ensure no undue mechanical strain on the trays or cables. Smooth and paint cut edges of trays and supports to prevent injury and corrosion.

Safety Considerations Use fall protection when working at heights. Avoid placing splice plates over supports or mid-span. Ensure temporary supports can handle the weight of fully loaded trays and installation personnel. Maintain electrical continuity if trays will serve as grounding paths, using bonding jumpers where necessary.

Temporary Cable Handling While trays are temporarily erected, cables can be loosely laid or guided through the trays using HDPE conduits or clamps at intervals of about 1 meter. Avoid overloading or stressi...
