Drop-Outs: For cables that exit the tray vertically to connect to equipment below, drop-out fittings provide a controlled path that protects cables from sharp bends or abrasion. Installation Considerations Support and Anchoring: Vertical trays must be supported using wall brackets, trapeze hangers, or other structural supports to prevent sagging and maintain alignment with horizontal trays. Cable Protection: Ensure that the bend radius of cables is not exceeded at the transition point. Ladder trays provide open rungs for ventilation, while ventilated troughs or solid-bottom trays offer additional support for smaller or sensitive cables...

On vertical cable trays and on edgewise – horizontal cable trays, each cable shall be fixed with 20mm wide stainless steel strips (two per meter).
