- Mechanical Splicing** Aligns fibers using a mechanical holder or sleeve without melting. Slightly higher loss (around 0.15–0.2 dB) but faster and easier to deploy. Ideal for temporary fixes, short-term installations, or situations without specialized equipment. Often performed inside fiber enclosures or splice trays to protect fibers and manage excess cable length.
