- OPL-4B Optical Fiber Pulse Link:** This is a system designed to transmit four multiplexed channels of metering pulses over long distances. The OPL-4B includes a transmitter (OPT-4B) and a receiver (OPR-4B), which can send pulses over up to 9 miles using multimode fiber or up to 68 miles using single-mode fiber, depending on fiber quality. It is commonly used for electric meter pulse transmission, with each input configurable as Form A (2-wire) or Form C (3-wire). The system uses standard ST twist-lock connectors for reliable and quick connections, and includes power supply, wetting voltage, isolation relay, and terminal block connectors for easy setup.
- MIL-STD-2042/4B Fiber Optic Cable Standard:** In military contexts, 4B refers to a standard practice for installing fiber optic cables on naval ships and submarines. This standard outlines methods for cableway installation, cable protection, and routing of optical fiber cables in harsh environments, ensuring durability and reliability in critical applications.
