

What is the appropriate height for wall-mounted network cabinets

Ergonomics and Maintenance: Position the cabinet so that technicians can reach the top and bottom of the rack comfortably. Swing-frame or pivoting cabinets can improve rear access without de-racking equipment.

Rack Unit Planning: Consider the total height of your equipment in Rack Units (1U = 1.75 inches) and allow extra space for future expansion.
