Fiber Termination Box: Indoor interface devices connecting FTTH drop cables to building fiber networks. They include fusion or mechanical splicing protection units and may house optical splitters. Multimedia Box: Comprehensive distribution boxes for homes or offices, housing ONUs, active communication equipment, and fiber terminals. Splice Closure: Dome-shaped enclosures for aerial, duct, or direct burial cables, providing high strength and corrosion resistance for splicing backbone and access fibers. Fiber Faceplate Panel: User terminal boxes for desktop or office connections, ensuring proper fiber bending radius and protection for indoor fiber deployment. Integration with Optical Cables Box-type optical cables are typically terminated with connectors such as LC, SC, or FC, and may be single-mode (OS1/OS2) or multimode (OM1-OM5) depending on network requirements. The cables are routed into boxes where they are spliced, connected,...
