Mounting HardwarePatch panels are designed to be installed in standard 19-inch racks or wall mounts. They include mounting brackets or holes on the sides to secure one or multiple panels in a rack, allowing for organized stacking and easy access.

Labeling and DocumentationMany patch panels include labeling strips or spaces above or below the ports to document connections. This helps in troubleshooting, network management, and maintaining a structured cabling system.
