

What to do if your new router doesn't have a fiber optic port

- Use the ISP-provided ONT:** Connect the fiber cable to the ONT, then use an Ethernet cable from the ONT's LAN port to your router's WAN port.
- Fiber Over Ethernet adapters:** Some adapters convert fiber to Ethernet, but they must support GPON protocols if your ISP uses GPON. Standard SFP transceivers or media converters usually cannot replace the ONT.
- Bridge Mode (Optional):** If your ONT supports bridge mode, it can pass the public IP directly to your router, allowing full control over LAN settings and port forwarding.
